- Youth Ministry Program The semester is on Saints and Christ's mission started in Jan. That semester had two Family events included in the youth nights. That Semester topic wrapped up on May 12. The last event was the Parish Picnic which all the youth were encouraged to attend with their family. September had started with the Kickoff of Youth ministry with a pool party. This semester was focused on Faithfulness and Trust in GOD. The semester on Trust and Faithfulness was well received. It wrapped up in Dec. with an Advent night and a Youth Christmas Party. The last event was the Parish Big Christmas party which all the youth were encouraged to attend with their family. We resumed on January 5th after the Christmas break with a new semester on Social Justice the importance of thinking of others.. It is moving along well.

- Confirmation Classes – began Monday, January 28 with the parent meeting. The first class for students was February 4. The students, Elaine and I were again excited about the journey we would be taking with these candidates. After the 6 Instructional classes the students went to serve with the Sisters of Charity in May, to do the soup kitchen social justice service. 





Incoming Chair - Neil MacNeil

- Pastoral Council holds regular monthly meetings with most committees/groups having key people attend.
- We have a good group of people around the table and we have good discussions on various topics that come up.
- We recently held our annual elections for 4 vacant positions on Council Liturgy, Community Services, Catechetics and Pastoral Council Chair.
- We were very concerned that initially, no one came forward to allow their name to stand for any of these positions. As it turned out, all positions except Liturgy were filled. Murielle and Lionel Collette agreed to serve as Co-Chairs for the Community Services committee. Rosanne Vas allowed her name to stand for a second term as the Catechetics Chair and Neil MacNeil has agreed to take on the role as PPC Chair.

- Council is also very concerned with the current state of Sunday Collections, as we ran a monthly deficit all of 2019. 2020 Budget projections have been adjusted accordingly to account for this loss in revenue.
- We will try and keep things operating as normal as possible, but it will be difficult with both financial and personnel shortfalls.
- The Diocese has initiated a Pastoral Renewal process that all Parish Councils are to go through. Part of this process is coming up with Parish Vision and Mission Statements. We have been working on this for more than 6 months and it is quite a process.

- We have the Vision Statement developed -
- "The Catholic faithful of Christ Our Saviour Parish are a united community of disciples actively living through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the prophetic (Evangelization), shepherding (service) and priestly (worship, liturgy and devotion) mission of Jesus."

Building Committee

- Back in July of 2014, the Parish Financial Administration Board assembled a Parish Expansion Committee with a mandate to organize the expansion of our rapidly shrinking building.
- Members of the Parish Expansion Committee are:

- An Architect was hired and in May of 2016, the Parish Expansion Committee did a joint presentation to the Parish along with the Fund Raising Committee. The results of the Parish Expansion Feasibility Study were presented at that time.
- In October of 2016, we did another joint presentation to the Parish with the Fund Raising Committee. The results of the Fund Raising Committee's survey were presented at that time.

Building Committee

- Earlier in 2017, we met with the Fund Raising Committee to review the results of the first phase of their campaign. It appeared that they would not reach their initial financial goal to be able to complete the entire expansion at one time.
- We reviewed the plans and decided that it would be possible to build the entire expanded shell at one time and then finish the inside with smaller projects as funds were accumulated. Phase 1 would include the expansion to the rear, expanded Sanctuary area for seating for 500, expanded parking lot, upgraded building services (electrical, gas, sewer, etc.). The basement would remain unfinished and the Narthex area of the existing building would remain as-is for now.
- This committee is currently in a holding pattern waiting until we have a funding plan secured with both the Parish and the Diocese. Once we have this plan, we will be able to re-engage with the Architect and commence the Detailed Design phase of the project, update pricing and then move into the Tendering and Construction phases.
- We are still at the start of an exciting project that will require each parishioner to get very involved in the Stewardship of this Parish.

<u> June 2019 – Parish Expansion/Fundraising Status Report</u>

- There have been a lot of questions and concerns from Parishioners brought to our attention wondering what the status of the Fundraising for the Parish Expansion is. At the March AGM, Parish Council committed to bringing a "Status Report" to the Parish before October. The report is as follows:
- In early March 2019, the Building Expansion Committee agreed that they would remain in place and that all active Building Expansion Planning is currently on "pause". This committee is ready to react to direction from Council or FAB.
- Parish Council received a letter dated May 05, 2019 from the Fundraising Committee advising that the Fundraising Committee had voted to "resign and disband" and also "will leave it to Parish Council on how to proceed".
- The funds that have been collected for the Parish Expansion can only be used for purposes that would involve new expansion related works and cannot be used for general maintenance. This does not mean that only a mega-project can proceed. Approval could be granted for a series of smaller projects that are part of the overall Expansion. FAB will be reviewing the timing of potential projects.
- The funds that have been collected for the Parish Expansion are currently held for us at the Diocese, as that is what is required by the Diocese. They also have greater investment leverage which results in a better return on our money than we could generate on our own. This is still our Parish's money!

- If you do not wish to contribute to the expansion fund until we have a firm project date, we ask that all of you continue to contribute to the regular Sunday collection.
- The expansion of this parish will eventually happen. The initial fundraising effort stalled for whatever reason, but it ultimately was meant to be. All we can do now is move forward and have faith that good things will happen in the future.
